From Pastor Sue:

I was overwhelmed Sunday (June 25) at worship and the picnic that afternoon by the sheer number of people who came up and wished me a meaningful and restful renewal leave. Sometimes you aren't aware of how many people you touch, and this past Sunday I got a taste of how many people my ministry at this church has touched. I think pastors going on a renewal leave are often anxious about their church members begrudging them this time, but you have encouraged me to take this leave with graciousness and love. What I also hadn't expected was the number of teachers who were excited for me! As one of them said - they get a renewal leave every summer, and they don't know how they would have made it all the years they did without those regular breaks.

This is my first one in almost 32 years of ordained ministry, and I leave now excited and knowing that I am supported and loved by you.

I'm very much looking forward to this time to rest from work, to step away from the hectic pace of ministry and being on call 24/7 for almost the entirety of the past almost 8 years, to reflect on my ministry, and reconnect with the source of life. I'm also realizing just how much I will miss being with you over the next three months. You are a part of my life, my thoughts, and my prayers, every single day, and to not be with you in weekly worship, doing ministry together, and just connecting over drinks or email feels very odd. And it may sound odd, but I'm already looking forward to reconnecting in three months, to see how you have grown and to share how I have grown.

I know you have questions about will happen during these three months. First, let me address the elephant in the room: it is not uncommon for churches to fear that their pastor will use their renewal leave to seek a new call. Take a breath - the whole goal of a renewal leave is so that your pastor can <u>return to you</u> refreshed, re-energized, and with renewed creativity, so that church and pastor can have many more years of fruitful ministry together. So I am coming back!

My renewal leave is July 5 – October 4. While I'm on leave, I will not be answering any church phone calls or emails. Carrie, Kris and Brian all know how to reach me should there be a need. Meanwhile, feel free to stalk me on Facebook if you want to see my photos while I'm on leave!

May each of us use this time to reconnect with God, reconnect with those who are important in our lives, and reconnect with our deepest selves, so that we can all continue to serve the church with energy, intelligence, imagination and love! I will pray for you daily, and I hope you will do the same for me.



June Session Highlights

Prayer:

• The Session has started a new habit of intentionally praying by name for our congregation. Every session meeting we pray for a portion of our congregation, and if we know specific needs, we lift that up as well. So know that you are remembered by name, and lifted up, and if you have any specific prayer requests, please don't hesitate to let us know.

Pastor Sue's Renewal Leave:

- Session reviewed the final coverage plans for those things Pastor Sue typically does, and to the best that we know, we've got it all covered! Guest Preachers are in place for every Sunday, (Kara Hillhouse, Carl Eskridge, Ray Meester, Beth Graverholt, Jane Holtzclaw, and Kris Brammer) and support for employees, committees and ministry teams is in place.
- Should there be a pastoral care need that the deacons need assistance with, we've got several local pastors on call to step in and help. Carrie, Kris and Brian have those contacts, and can invite them in if needed at a moment's notice.
- The Session is going to take advantage of this time to do some leadership development with Steve Henderson, and deacons and Foundation board members are invited to participate (watch for more info)
- Session is going to read "We Aren't Broke: Uncovering Hidden Resources for Mission and Ministry" by Mark Elsdon during the renewal leave time.
- Session continues to pray for our church and our future, and to ask where God is leading us and how we can be a part of what God is doing. (We do this whether we are in a season of renewal or not, because God is constantly speaking it's up to us to be always listening!)

Other things the Session did:

- Communication: Recognizing the need for good communication, both within and beyond the church, the Session is exploring the possibility of hiring a part-time communications person. This is in the early stages, so pray for us as we develop a job description. (We already have money in the budget for this.)
- Congregational Meeting Sept 10: This is a called meeting to approve bylaw changes to the church and foundation bylaws related to the nomination and election process, and to elect ruling elders, deacons, at-large congregational nominating committee members, and foundation board members. This will be a short meeting immediately after worship.
- **Session Member Job Description:** We received a draft session member job description, and will put that on the August agenda for review.
- Membership Roll Review: We are in the process of our annual review of membership rolls.
- **Monday Devotions:** Session members are signing up to provide the Monday Devotions while Pastor Sue is on renewal leave.

Youth Mission Trip Review



Our fourteenth Spring Fellowship Trip was held May 26th-29th in the Crawford area of the northwestern corner of the Nebraska Panhandle. We stayed in the lodging and campground at Fort Robinson and focused our learning adventures on the land management, conservation, recreation, culture, and history of the area.

On Friday, we stopped at the Nebraska National Forest near Halsey for an overview of the outcomes of the severe Bovee fire in October 2022 and we visited Seneca with local ranchers and landowners to learn the history of a small former railroad and ranching town in the Nebraska Sandhills.





Saturday was a fast-paced day of visiting the natural beauty of Pine Ridge public lands at Sowbelly Canyon and Chadron State Park, where we also heard about fire's impact on forest management, then gaining new knowledge about Basque sheepherding and sheep operations from Basque sheep rancher Dave Paris at his sheep and cattle ranch.



We also spent time at the Museum of the Fur Trade viewing exhibits with thousands of original artifacts that preserve the rich, amazing history of the North American fur trade. Following a delicious potluck breakfast and beautiful worship service in the morning, Sunday was a recreational day filled with horseback and jeep riding, fishing, hiking, attending a play at the fort's theatre, and sightseeing.

The group joined together in the evenings for meals, fun and conviviality with both relaxing and competitive games, and simply fabulous fellowship. Most of the group returned to Lincoln on Monday. We truly had a wonderful time and have started discussing the destination of FPC's Spring Fellowship Trip 15!
